

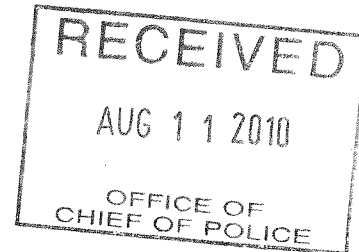

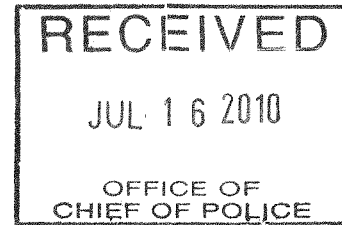

Re: Outstanding Officers


In recent weeks the Gemma House program has experienced the high level commitment two of your officers bring to their work and I wish to commend them to you by name.

✓ The first is Corporal Tracy Dunnigan. On her personal time, she came to our facility to speak plainly to a resident who did not appreciate how her combative behaviour could bring criminal charges. The clarity with which Corporal Dunnigan presented the consequences had a definite impact on this young woman whose behaviour improved dramatically in the days following. I believe the time Corporal Dunnigan invested may keep this vulnerable young woman out of the criminal justice system.

✓ In the second case, my staff was concerned about a man from the neighborhood who was found urinating on our property in view of our residents. Constable Anthony Bonk responded to our call. He was sensitive to our concerns for the safety of our young residents reassuring us the man was not a pedophile. But he took additional time to track down the man, who is a new immigrant to Canada, to ensure he understood the seriousness of this behaviour. Because of the effort Constable Bonk took on our behalf, we have not had any further concerns with our neighbor.

Chief Hagen, the dedication of your officers to the people of this city is second to none. Thank you for the leadership you provide which allows for this level of service.
