Re: Regina Police Service Integrated Health and Wellness Section

RECOMMENDATION

CONCLUSION

The Police Administration wishes to provide the Board with information regarding the functions and duties of various Sections within the Regina Police Service (RPS) through ongoing presentations at Board meetings. One of the goals within the 2023-2026 Strategic Plan is “Building an equitable, diverse, inclusive and supportive culture that promotes employee engagement and the health and well-being of all employees”. To that end, this report will provide insight into the range of supports that the Integrated Health and Wellness unit offers to the employees of the Regina Police Service.

BACKGROUND

The health and well-being of employees has been a long-standing priority for the Regina Police Service. Prior to 2022, programs and initiatives related to the health and wellness were the responsibility of the Human Resources Department.

In response to the increasing strategic demands associated with human resources and health and wellness programming, and in alignment with best practices recommending the separation of the health and wellness function from traditional HR structures, RPS proposed the establishment of an Integrated Health and Wellness (IHW) section in 2021. This new section was designed to operate independently from, yet collaboratively with, Human Resources. In 2022, the Board of Police Commissioners and City Council approved the creation of the Integrated Wellness Manager position, formally establishing the IHW unit.

DISCUSSION

Mandate and objectives

Reporting to the Executive Director of Corporate Services, the Integrated Health & Wellness section has the mandate to promote, support, and empower a healthy workplace culture by enhancing the physical, mental, and emotional well-being of the whole person.

The objectives of the IHW section are to:

- Lead and support employee health & safety through the prevention and management of all workplace incidents,
- Support and enhance employee mental, emotional and physical well-being,
- Support and enhance employee resilience,

- Educate and promote healthy lifestyle behaviours,
- Implement evidence based health and well-being initiatives and programs,
- Assess and evaluate Health & Wellness initiatives and programming metrics, and
- Enhance internal and external collaborative partnerships that nurtures the culture and values of the Regina Police Service.

Program Highlights

A. Physical support

IHW offers programming aimed at supporting the complex physical demands of policing. These services include:

- Timely assessment and treatment of workplace injuries in order to facilitate recovery and reduce time loss from work
- Yearly baseline concussion screening for high risk positions in our Service
- Ergonomic assessments for vehicles and equipment
- Preventative training and education sessions to prevent workplace-related injuries and repetitive strain

B. Psychological support

Police employees are exposed to a higher number of traumatic events as compared to the public and are disproportionately affected by occupational stress injuries. IHW has programming that offer the following psychological supports:

- Safeguard Program – a safeguard program is a formal, coordinated system of psychological health checks for sworn officers and civilians identified by the Service as having a high likelihood of exposure to potentially traumatizing situations or content in the course of their regular duties
- Individual support from a psychologist following critical incidents
- Pre-employment psychological evaluation process to better assist with hiring candidates psychologically suited to a career in law enforcement;
- Annual mental health campaigns to raise awareness and to provide education to all RPS employees on psychological health;
- Case consultation regarding psychological injury treatment to facilitate return-to-work processes;
- Psychological consultations provided to employees to help determine individual needs and assist in getting employees connected to appropriate community providers in coordination with the Employee and Family Assistance Program; and

C. Other internal supports

The Employee & Family Assistance Program (EFAP) and the Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) Program are the two most established and accessed employee support programs at the Regina Police Service.

- The EFAP (Employee & Family Assistance Program) is in place to assist employees and their families with personal challenges such as mental health concerns, substance use, grief and relationships issues. The Program is voluntary, 100% confidential and empowers employees and their family members

to seek professional help on their own terms. All costs are covered by the Regina Police Service.

- The RPS Critical Incident Stress Management Team is comprised of peers both sworn and civilian, in addition to our employee psychologist and support from the RPS Chaplains. In 2023, IHW just recently expanded the CISM Team from 15 to 24 team members. The CISM Team is there to assist sworn members and civilians following a critical incident. These critical incidents include but are not limited to: an officer involved shooting, an officer seriously injured, suicide of a member, or a child death.
There were 15 debriefs in 2024.

In 2023, IHW started offering Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) courses to employees at RPS, beginning with the senior management team. Five sessions have been provided in total, with approximately 100 civilian and sworn employees being trained. MHFA is also now embedded in the in-service curriculum for all new Alternative Response Officers.

MHFA aims to improve mental health literacy, and provide the skills and knowledge to help people better manage emerging mental health or substance use problems. This evidence-based course is offered over two consecutive dates and provides participants with the following:

- Tools to recognize signs of decline in mental well-being
- Ability to talk about their mental health
- Knowledge to discuss professional and other supports that could help with recovery or improved mental well-being
- Confidence to reach out to these supports
- Tools to assist during a mental health or substance use crisis
- Knowledge to use MHFA actions to maintain one's own mental wellness

D. Partnerships and Research

The Regina Police Service maintains several academic partnerships focused on advancing mental wellness programming for public safety personnel. These collaborations provide our employees with access to a range of innovative, evidence-based mental health initiatives.

- One notable new partnership is with the Psychological Trauma and Stress Systems (PTSS) Lab at the University of Regina, led by Dr. Nick Carleton. Through this partnership, the Regina Police Service will implement Emotional Resilience Skills Training (ERST) for all employees. This initiative features a self-monitoring system designed to deliver near real-time insights into individual stress levels, supporting the early detection of stress indicators and encouraging timely access to appropriate mental health resources.

CONCLUSION

The crime statistics for the month of June 2025, reflect a year-to-date decrease in Crimes Against the Person of (-15.4%) compared to June of 2024. As well, Crimes Against Property shows a year-to-date decrease of (-16.7%) compared to June 2024. Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property show a combined year-to-date decrease of (-16.4%).

BACKGROUND

Each month, reports providing statistics for the City of Regina are presented to the Board for their review and information. This report will provide statistics for the month of June 2025. The Communications Centre statistics are included showing the total calls for service.

DISCUSSION

Total Crimes Against Property reflects a decrease of (-877) reported incidents over 2024. Theft Under \$5000 has also seen a decrease of (289) reported incidents over 2024. There are [-282] fewer reported incidents of Mischief / Wilful Damage for a [-28.3%] decrease. Thefts of Auto rates have decreased by (-59) reported incidents, for an overall decrease of (-24.3%) in our year-to-date stats.

Overall, in June 2025, the Regina Police Service received (-1,155) fewer reported incidents of Crimes Against the Person and Crimes Against Property combined over 2024 for a decrease of (-16.4%).

Arsons continue to be a pressure point in the City. There is a year-to-date increase of 10.4% or 28 incidents. The large majority of these incidents are garbage bin fires accounting for 49% of all Arsons. The Regina Police Service is working collaboratively with the City of Regina and Regina Fire and Protective Services to address this issue.

There were a total of 5,317 dispatched Calls for Service in June, for a year-to-date decrease of (-3.2%) compared to 2024, and Alarm Calls for Service show a year to date increase of (4.9%).

A dashboard has been created to provide monthly quantitative information on current crime trends and community safety concerns.

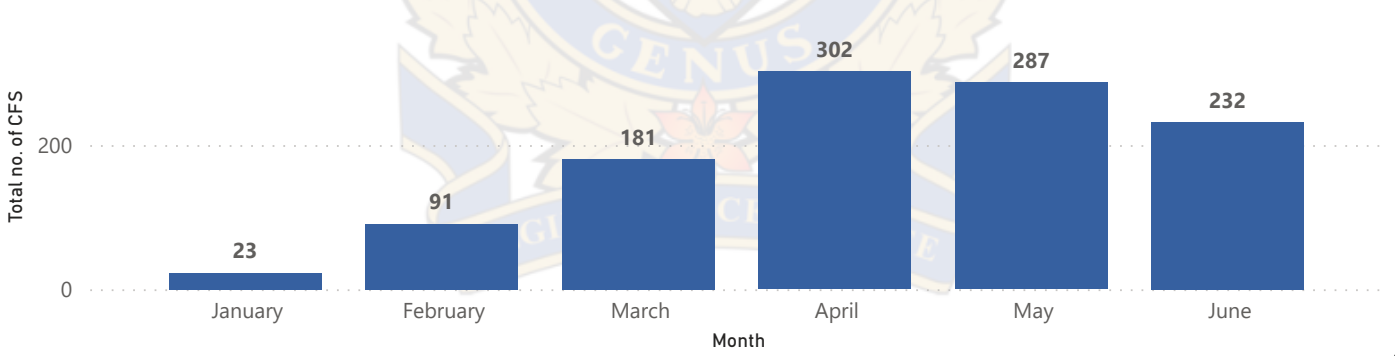

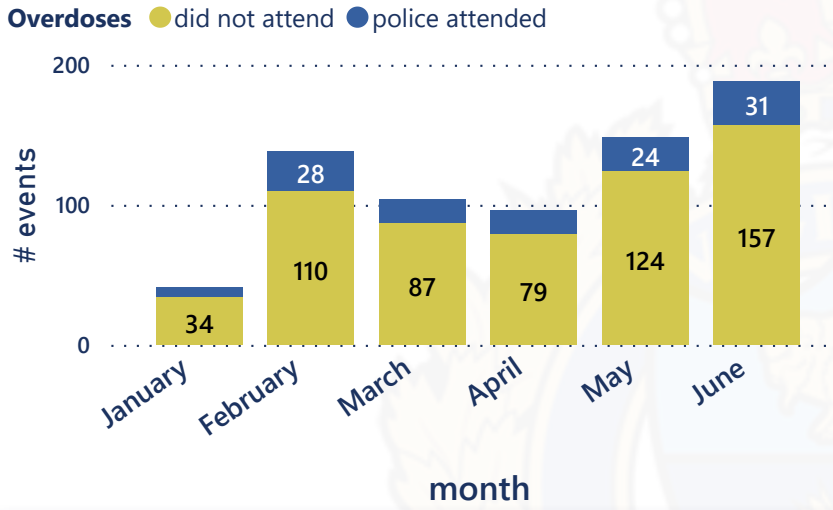

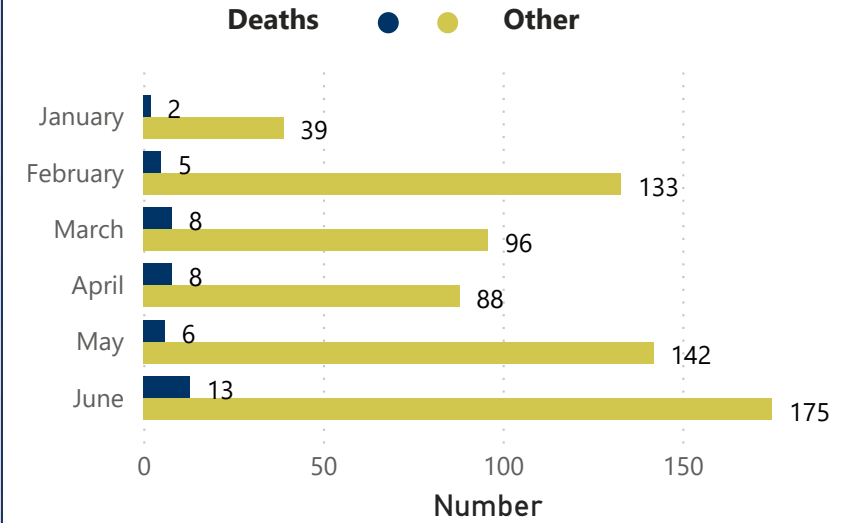

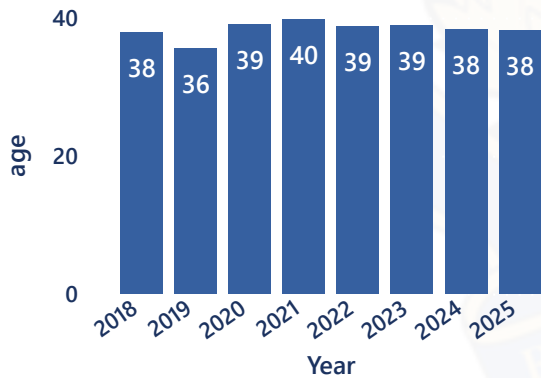

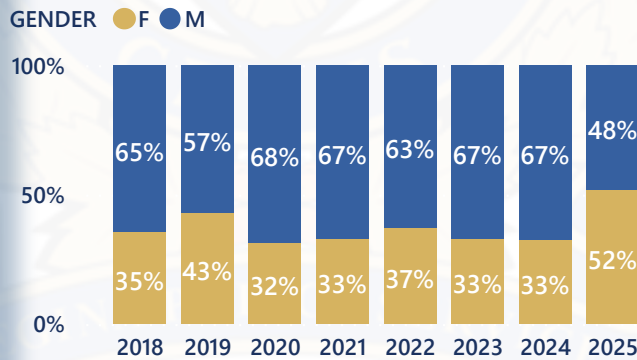

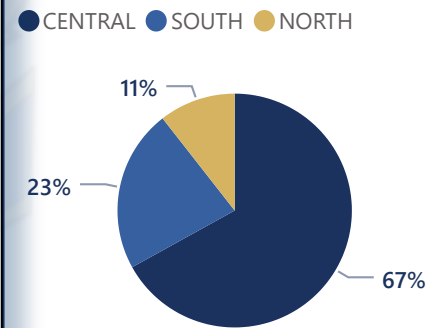
Average Age of Deceased, by Year



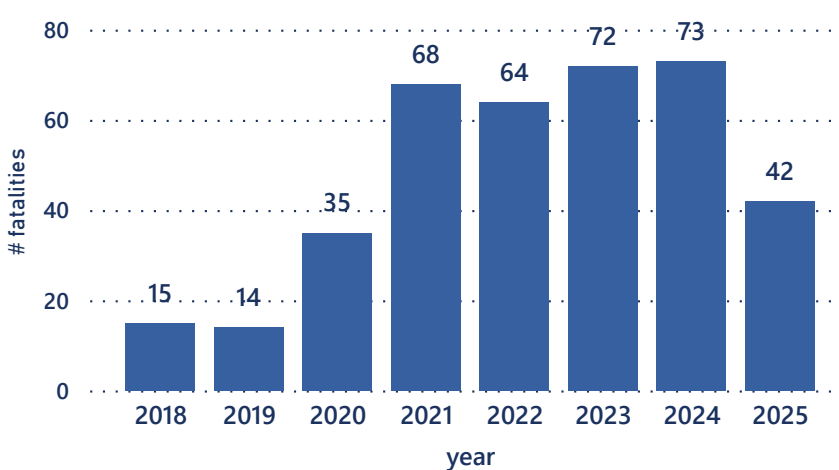
Deaths by Gender and Year
